## **HARINGEY COUNCIL – PUBLIC NOTICE** **The Haringey (Prescribed Routes) (No. 13) Traffic Order 2021** **The Haringey (Prescribed Routes) (No. 14) Traffic Order 2021**

1. **Notice is hereby given** that the Council of the London Borough of Haringey on the 1 April 2021 made the above mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. **The general effect of the Orders:-**
  - (a) To formalise the existing left turn only for vehicles travelling in a north westerly direction on Crescent Rise, N11 to turn left in to Durnsford Road only. Vehicles are not permitted to turn right at this junction. There will be an exemption for cyclists.
  - (b) To formalise the existing prohibition of u-turns on Durnsford Road, N11 between its junction with Crescent Rise and a point 100 yards south-west of that junction.
- 'The Haringey (Prescribed Routes) (No. 5) Traffic Order 2010' is hereby revoked, the restrictions contained within the aforementioned order shall continue in force by virtue of the new orders.
3. Copies of the Orders referred to above, which will come into force on 8 April 2021, of plans which indicates the locations and effects of the Orders, and of a Statement of Reasons for making the Orders, may be inspected at the reception desk, Alexandra House, 10 Station Road, Wood Green, N22 7TR or can be viewed online, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, at [www.haringey.gov.uk/traffic\\_orders](http://www.haringey.gov.uk/traffic_orders).
4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it does not comply with the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
