

**HARINGEY COUNCIL – PUBLIC NOTICE
VARIOUS ROADS – PROPOSED BICYCLE PARKING PLACES**

**THE HARINGEY (PEDAL CYCLE PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO. 3) ORDER 2021 AND VARIOUS
CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE AMENDMENT ORDERS**

1. **Notice is hereby given** that the Council of the London Borough of Haringey on 23 February 2021 made the above mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 63 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. **The general effect of the Orders** would be to formalise new bicycle parking places at the following locations:-
 - (a) Belmont Road N15, outside No. 39 Belmont Road;
 - (b) Christchurch Road N8, outside No. 10 Christchurch Road;
 - (c) Darwin Road N22, along the flank wall of No. 196 Gladstone Avenue;
 - (d) Elmar Road N15, along the flank wall of No. 2 Elmar Road;
 - (e) Florence Road N4, opposite No. 3 Florence Road;
 - (f) Keston Road N17, outside No. 39 Keston Road;
 - (g) Lancaster Road N4, outside No. 74 Lancaster Road;
 - (h) Lorne Road N4, along the flank wall of No. 49 Victoria Road;
 - (i) Queens Avenue N10, outside No. 38 Queens Avenue;
 - (j) Stapleton Hall Road N4, outside No. 129 Stapleton Hall Road

the bicycle parking places are 2 metres wide and 2.5 metres in length.

3. Copies of the Orders referred to above, which will come into force on 4 March 2021, of plans which indicate the locations and effects of the Orders, and of a Statement of Reasons for making the Orders, may either be inspected by appointment at the reception desk, Alexandra House, 10 Station Road, Wood Green, N22 7TR or can be viewed online, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, at www.haringey.gov.uk/traffic_orders.
4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it does not comply with the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
