Public consultation on parking controls

Tottenham Hale North Event Day (THNED)

Dear Resident or Business,

The Council last reviewed parking controls in your area in 2017. At that time there was limited support for the introduction of a Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) and as a consequence the current Event Days Controls were retained.

It is now clear that parking pressures are more intense, and many residents have indicated support for a CPZ. This has involved a petition as well as feedback from individual residents and businesses that parking behaviours have changed. This may be due to a number of factors including new developments, including the new Tottenham Hotspur Football Club stadium, as well as the introduction of parking controls in the surrounding area.

In response to this feedback, and to ensure that the council delivers parking measures that meet the needs of the community, we are consulting once again with residents and businesses to determine if daily parking controls are now supported, and if so what operating days and times are preferred. This will in addition to the existing Event Day Controls protect your roads during large events at the Tottenham Hotspur Football Club stadium.

Have your say

We would like to know if you are in favour of having a Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) introduced, and if so what days and times you prefer. We would also like to hear of any road that has wider safety issues that could be affecting your community.

Encouraging more people to cycle is a vital part of our plan to tackle congestion, improve air quality, promote physical activity, and improve accessibility. As the number of people who cycle increases, we recognise the need for safe and secure cycle parking. As part of this exercise we are asking residents if they support the installation of cycle storage facilities in your road. This information will help us establish areas of demand and develop future programmes.

To promote and encourage the uptake of Electric Vehicles we are considering further locations to increase the number of Electric Vehicle charging points/bays available in the borough. If you would like to request an on-street charging point, or suggest a location to be considered, then please provide details within the comments section of the questionnaire.

Dedicated Disabled Parking Bays are one of the concessions being offered by the Council to accommodate residents with severe walking impairments and those residents who cannot travel far to their vehicle. The bays are intended to provide the eligible residents ease of access to and from their property, ensuring that those with wheelchairs and other walking aids have sufficient room to manoeuvre in and out of their vehicle. If you would like to request an on-street charging point, or suggest a location to be considered, then please provide details within

Residents in car free developments will be aware that they will not be eligible to apply for permits to park within CPZs. This a London wide Mayoral planning policy to encourage the uptake of sustainable modes of travel such as walking, cycling and the use of local transport. However, car free developments will be entitled to apply for visitor vouchers to park within the zone.

Homes for Haringey residents are eligible to apply for parking permits to park on the public highway within the CPZ, but will not have parking restrictions installed on their estate areas.


