CROUCH END

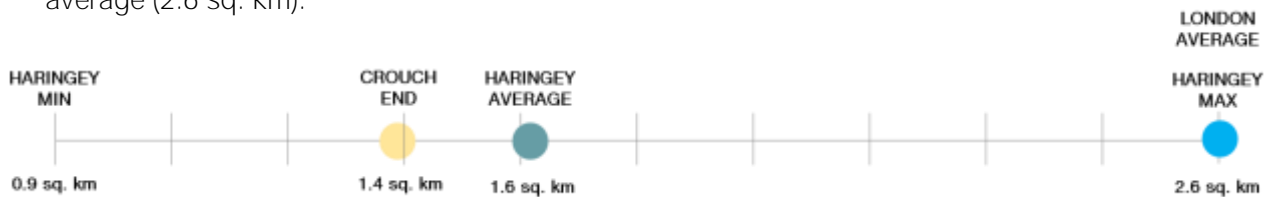


Haringey's Ward Profiles rely on data sources that provide a breakdown to ward-level. Such granular data is less widely available than data at regional or borough level, and as such certain measures use data going back to the 2011 Census. Please be aware of the source and year when using the data cited in this profile.

ATTRIBUTES

SIZE OF WARD (SQ. KM), CROUCH END

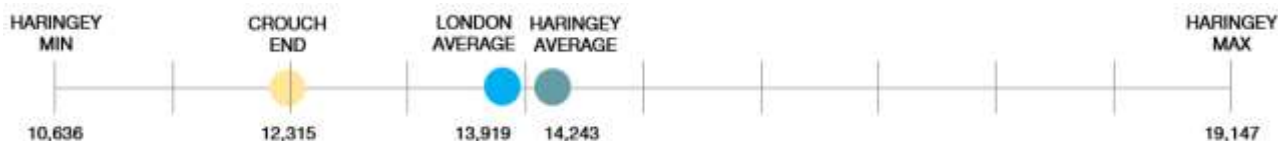
- Crouch End is a smaller ward than the Haringey average, at 1.4 sq. km.
- Both Crouch End and the Haringey average (1.6 sq. km) are substantially smaller than the London average (2.6 sq. km).

POPULATION, CROUCH END

- Crouch End has a smaller population than the average Haringey (14,243) or London (13,919) ward, at 12,315 residents. This is the 5th smallest population of all Haringey wards.

POPULATION DENSITY (RESIDENTS PER SQ. KM), CROUCH END

- Crouch End has a significantly smaller than average population density (8,416 residents per sq. km) compared to the Haringey average (9,945) and is in line with the average London ward (8,742)

OPEN SPACE, CROUCH END

- 13.9% of Crouch End ward is made up of open space, the fifth smallest proportion of all Haringey wards. This is also low compared to the average Haringey (25.2%) and London (27.2%) wards.

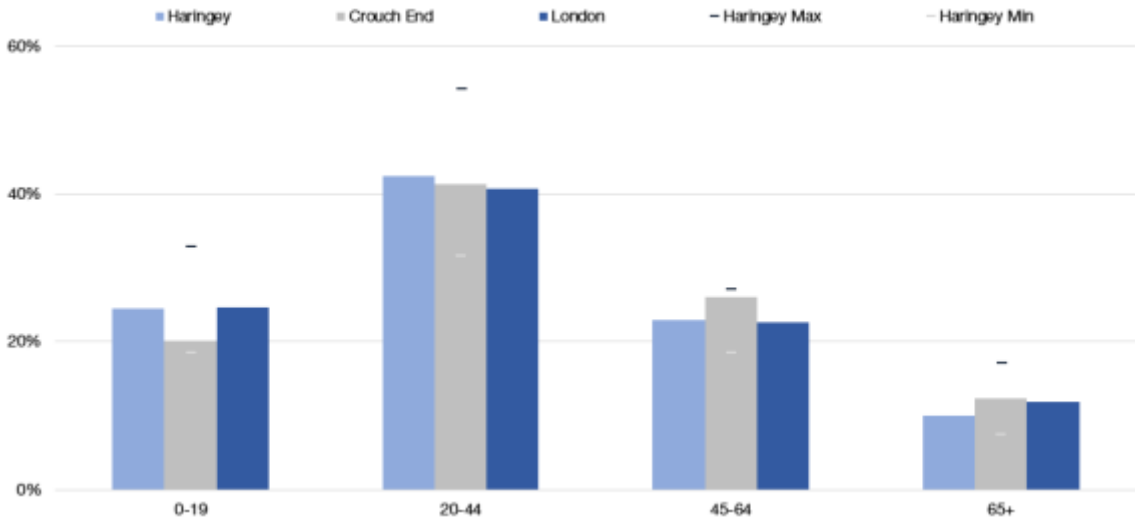

DEMOGRAPHICS

POPULATION AGE, CROUCH END

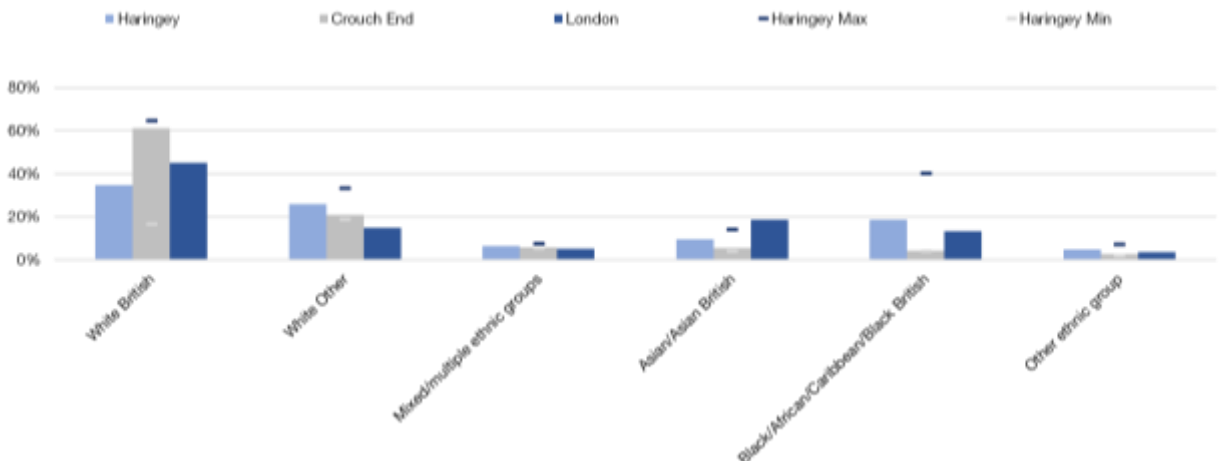
- Crouch End's overall population spread mirrors that seen in Haringey more widely, with 41.3% of residents aged 20-44.
- The 0-19 population is fairly under-represented in Crouch End compared to other wards, with 20.1% of all residents falling into this age category, compared to 24.4% in Haringey more widely.

ETHNICITY, CROUCH END

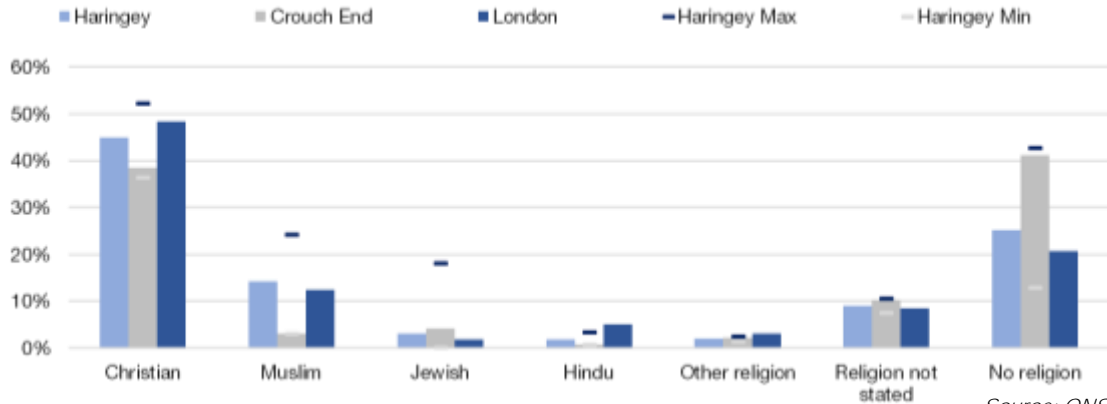
- Crouch End has a significantly larger proportion of residents whose ethnicity is White British (61.1%), compared to the wider Haringey population (34.7%). This is the major ethnic group in Crouch End.
- Residents of Asian and those of Black ethnicity are under-represented in Crouch End, with the proportion of residents of Black ethnicity being the lowest of all Haringey wards (4.3%).

RELIGION, CROUCH END

- Compared to the rest of Haringey, Crouch End has a larger than average proportion of residents identifying as having no religion (41.2%, compared to 25.2% across Haringey).
- Christian and Muslim residents are particularly under-represented within Crouch End, compared to the rest of the borough.

EDUCATION & QUALIFICATIONS

% PUPILS MEETING THE EXPECTED STANDARD AT KEY STAGE 2, CROUCH END

- At KS2 Crouch End pupils perform above average, with 86.4% reaching the expected standard at this stage (the highest in the borough), compared to 67.4% and 71.4% in Haringey and London respectively.

% PUPILS ACHIEVING GRADES 9-4 IN ENGLISH & MATHS, CROUCH END

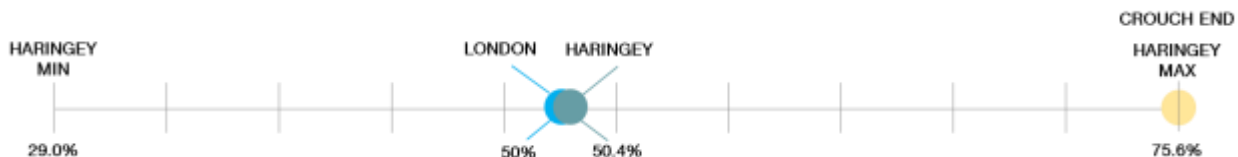
- In Crouch End, the proportion of pupils achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths GCSEs (85.4%) is significantly higher than the Haringey and London averages (65.1% and 68.8% respectively).
- Crouch End have the third highest proportion of pupils achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths GCSEs in Haringey.

% QUALIFICATIONS AT LEVEL 3 AND ABOVE, CROUCH END

- In Crouch End, the proportion of residents with qualifications at level 3 or higher (75.6%) is significantly higher than both Haringey and London (50.4% and 50% respectively).
- Crouch End has the largest proportion of residents with qualifications at level 3 or higher of all Haringey wards.

INCOME, EMPLOYMENT & TENURE

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME, CROUCH END

- The median household income in Crouch End is £52,070 a year. This is substantially higher than the Haringey (£37,696) and London (£39,264) averages and is the third highest rate of all Haringey wards.

UNEMPLOYMENT, CROUCH END

- 4.6% of Crouch End's residents are unemployed. This is significantly lower than the Haringey (8.6%) and London (7.3%) averages.
- Crouch End has the second lowest level of unemployment in Haringey (joint with Muswell Hill).

CLAIMANTS (INC. UNIVERSAL CREDIT & JSA), CROUCH END

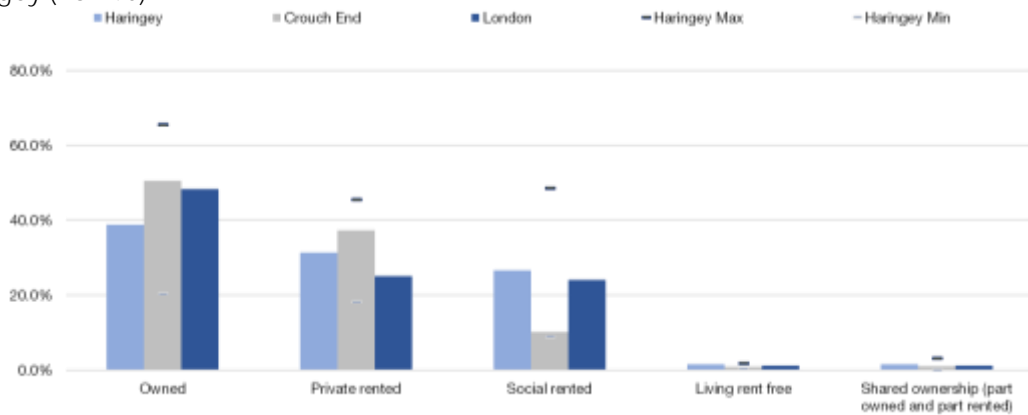
- In Crouch End there are 109.6 claimants per 10,000 residents who claim benefit principally for the reason of being unemployed.
- This is substantially below the Haringey and London level (251.8 per 10,000 residents and 201.7 per 10,000 residents respectively), and is the second lowest rate in the borough.
- The rate of claimants in Haringey is almost 25% higher than the London rate.

HOUSING TENURE, CROUCH END

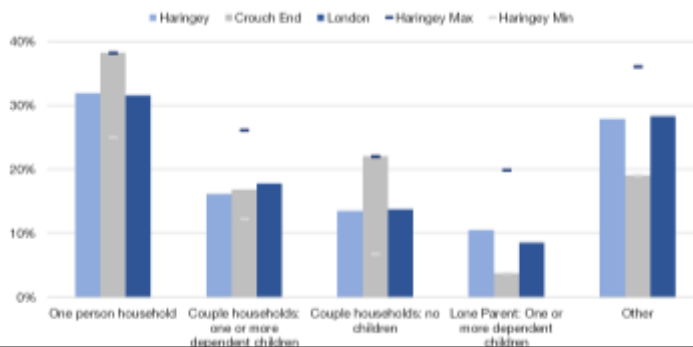
- In Crouch End households are more likely to be lived in by the homeowners (50.6%) compared to the wider Haringey level (38.8%).
- Socially rented households are significantly under-represented in Crouch End (10.2%), compared to Haringey (26.7%).

HOUSING COMPOSITION, CROUCH END

- Crouch End has the largest proportion of residents living in a one person household (38.2%), and the largest proportion living in a couple household with no children (22.1%), of all Haringey wards.
- Lone parent households with dependent children are significantly under-represented in Crouch End (3.8% - the lowest rate of all wards in the borough).

HEALTH, WELLBEING & CRIME

FEMALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, CROUCH END

- Female life expectancy in Crouch End is 85.5 years, above both the Haringey (84.6) and London (84.4) averages.

MALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, CROUCH END

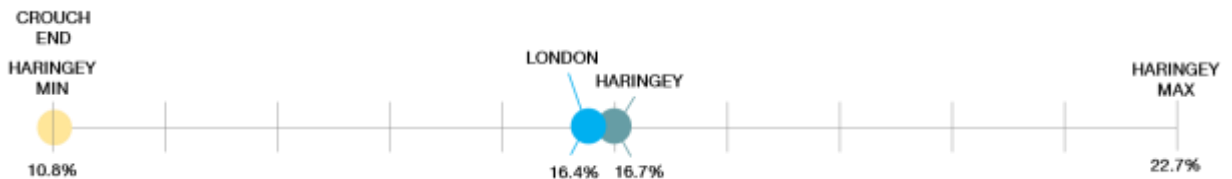
- Crouch End ward has the highest male life expectancy of all Haringey wards, at 82.6 years. This is significantly higher than the Haringey (79.9) and London (80.1) averages.

RESIDENTS WITH A LIMITING LONG-TERM HEALTH PROBLEM OR DISABILITY, CROUCH END

- In Crouch End only 10.8% of residents have a limiting long-term health problem or disability. This is the smallest proportion of all Haringey wards.

% PREVALENCE OF EXCESS WEIGHT IN YEAR 6, CROUCH END

- 22.6% of Year 6 children in Crouch End have excess weight. This is significantly below both the Haringey (36.1%) and London (36.8%) averages, and is the fourth lowest level of all wards in the borough.

RATE OF CRIME, CROUCH END

- In Crouch End there were 192 crimes per 1,000 residents between January 2018 and December 2019 (this relates to any type of crime, from drug use or theft to violence against the person).
- This was below the Haringey and in line with the London levels (229 per 1,000 residents and 193 per 1,000 residents respectively).
- The rate of crime in Haringey is more than 18% above the London rate.
