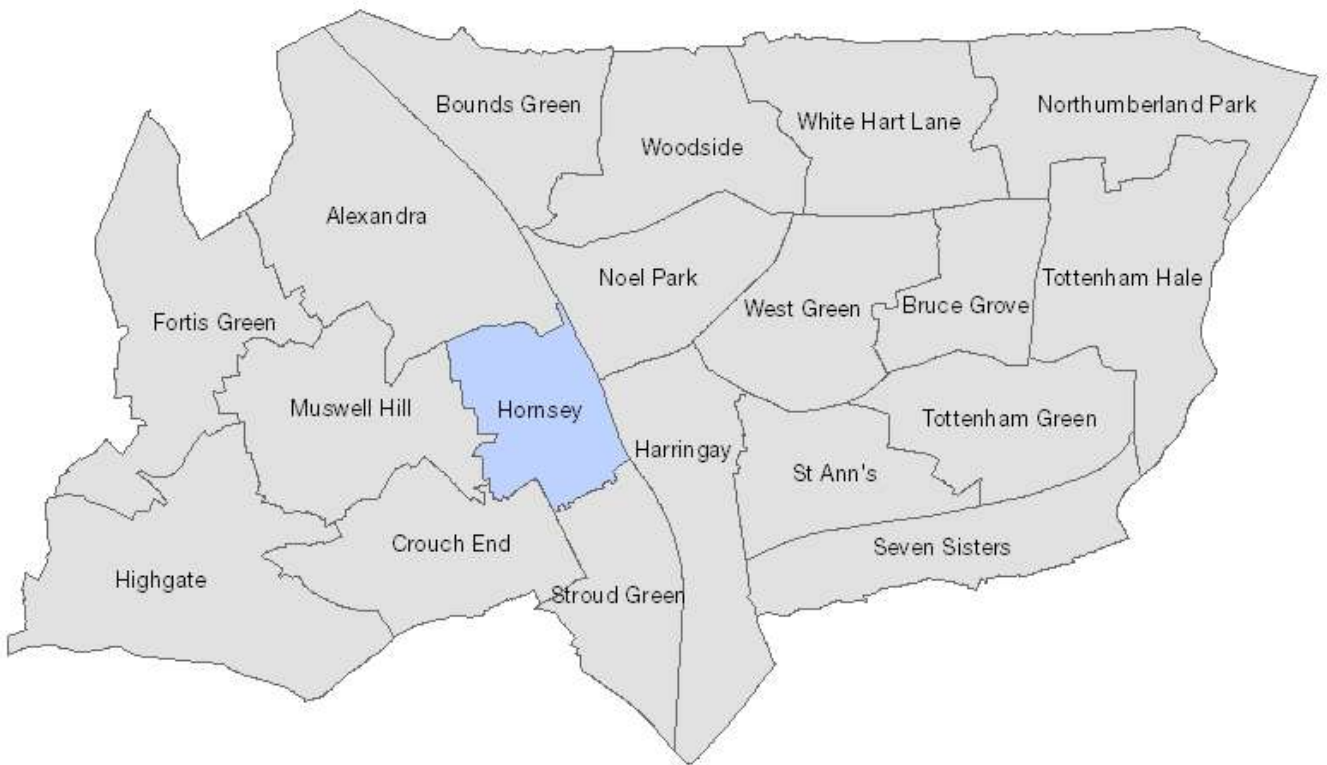


# HARINGEY WARD PROFILE: HORNSEY



*Haringey's Ward Profiles rely on data sources that provide a breakdown to ward-level. Such granular data is less widely available than data at regional or borough level, and as such certain measures use data going back to the 2011 Census. Please be aware of the source and year when using the data cited in this profile.*

# HORNSEY ATTRIBUTES

## SIZE OF WARD (SQ. KM), HORNSEY

- At 1.1 sq. km, Hornsey is smaller than the Haringey average (1.6 sq. km), and less than half the size of the average London ward (2.6 sq. km).
- Hornsey is the second smallest ward in the borough (joint with St Ann's and Stroud Green).

## POPULATION, HORNSEY

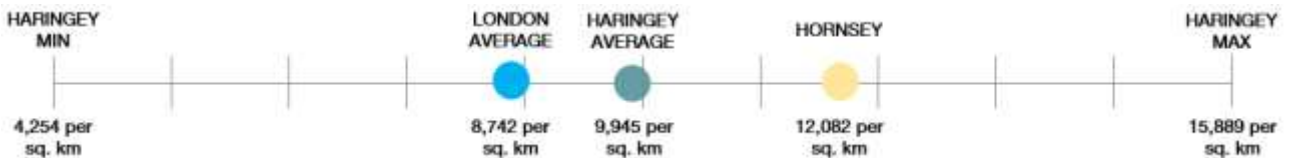
- Hornsey has 13,003 residents, below the Haringey (14,243) and London (13,919) averages. Haringey wards on the whole tend to have more residents than the average across London.

## POPULATION DENSITY (RESIDENTS PER SQ. KM), HORNSEY

- Population density in Hornsey is above the Haringey average, at 12,082 residents per sq. km (compared to an average of 9,945 in Haringey and 8,742 in London).

## OPEN SPACE, HORNSEY

- 10% of Hornsey ward is made up of open space, much less than the Haringey (25.2%) and London (27.2%) averages.
- Hornsey has the second smallest proportion of open space of all Haringey wards.

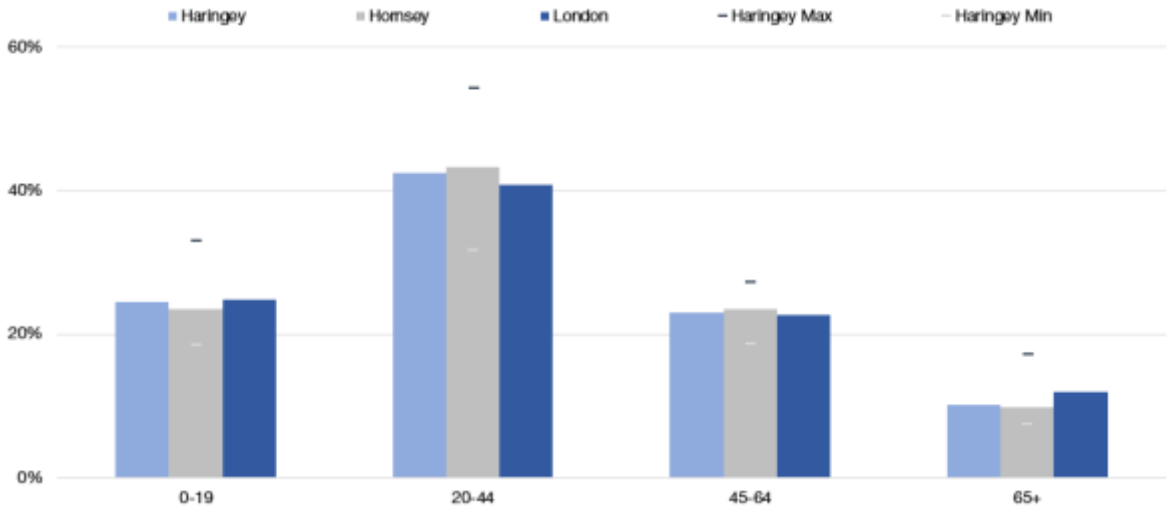

# DEMOGRAPHICS

## POPULATION AGE, HORNSEY

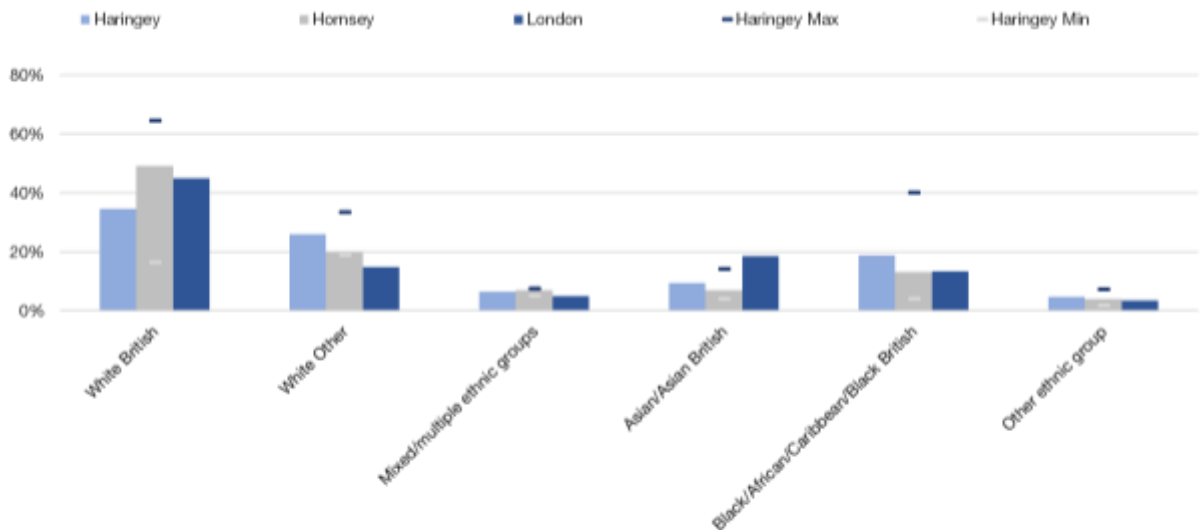
- Hornsey's overall population spread mirrors that seen in Haringey more widely, with those aged 20-44 making up the largest proportion of residents (43.2%).
- Despite some variation, no age group is substantially over-represented or under-represented in Hornsey, compared to the Haringey average.

## ETHNICITY, HORNSEY

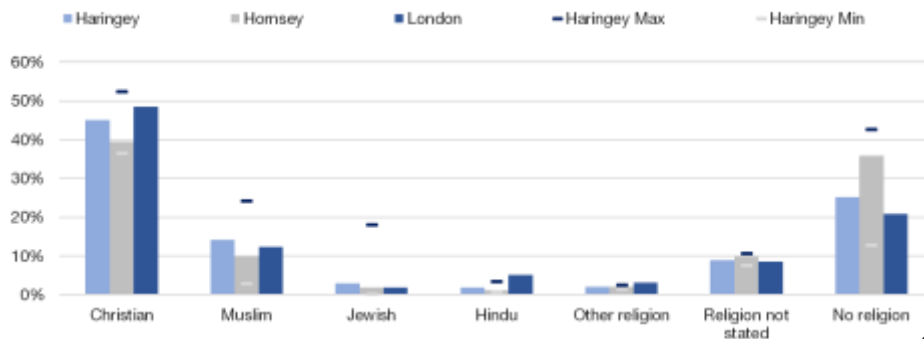
- In Hornsey those of White British ethnicity represent the largest group (49.2%). This group is also over-represented in Hornsey compared to the Haringey average (34.7%).
- Those of White Other, Asian or Black ethnicity are slightly under-represented in Hornsey, compared to the Haringey average.

## RELIGION, HORNSEY

- Hornsey has a higher proportion of residents identifying as having no religion (35.8%) than the Haringey average (25.2%).
- By contrast, those of Christian and Muslim religion are under-represented in the ward.

## EDUCATION & QUALIFICATIONS

### % PUPILS MEETING THE EXPECTED STANDARD AT KEY STAGE 2, HORNSEY

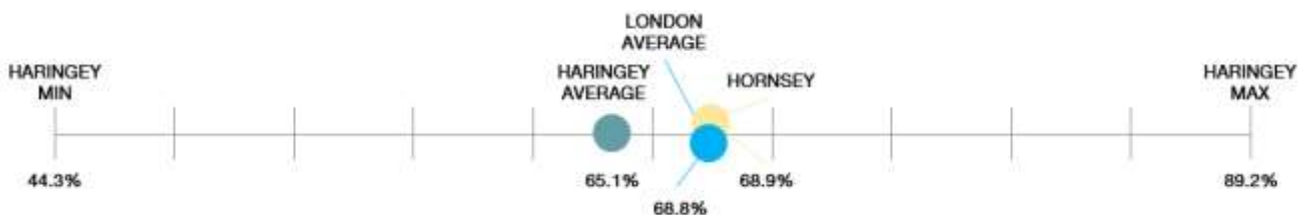
- Hornsey has a smaller proportion of pupils meeting the expected standard at KS2 level than the average in Haringey (67.4%) or London (71.4%).
- This is the third lowest rate in the borough.

### % PUPILS ACHIEVING GRADES 9-4 IN ENGLISH & MATHS, HORNSEY

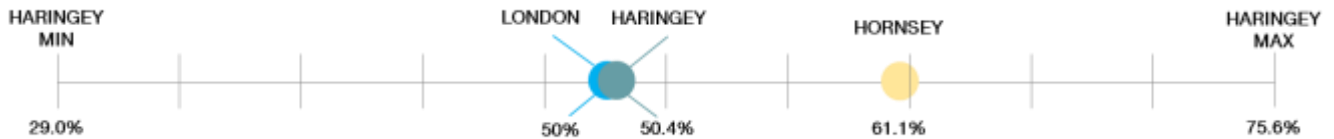
- In Hornsey, the proportion of pupils achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths GCSEs (68.9%) is in line with the London average (68.8%).
- Hornsey performs above the Haringey average (65.1%).

## % QUALIFICATIONS AT LEVEL 3 AND ABOVE, HORNSEY

- In Hornsey, the proportion of residents with qualifications at level 3 or higher (61.1%) is above the Haringey (50.4%) and London (50%) averages.
- There is substantial variation in qualification level among different Haringey wards, ranging from 29% being qualified to level 3 or higher, to 75.6%.

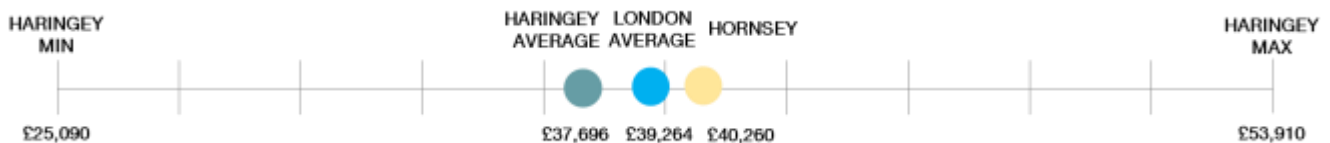

## INCOME, EMPLOYMENT & TENURE

### MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME, HORNSEY

- The median household income in Hornsey is £40,260 a year. This is higher than the Haringey (£37,696) and London (£39,264) averages, though it is not among the highest levels of all Haringey wards.

### UNEMPLOYMENT, HORNSEY

- 8.3% of Hornsey residents are unemployed. This is in line with the Haringey average (8.6%), and slightly higher than the London rate (7.3%).

## CLAIMANTS (INC. UNIVERSAL CREDIT & JSA), HORNSEY

- In Hornsey there are 292.2 claimants per 10,000 residents who claim benefit principally for the reason of being unemployed.
- This is substantially above both the Haringey and London levels (251.8 per 10,000 residents and 201.7 per 10,000 residents respectively).
- The rate of claimants in Haringey is almost 25% higher than the London rate.

## HOUSING TENURE, HORNSEY

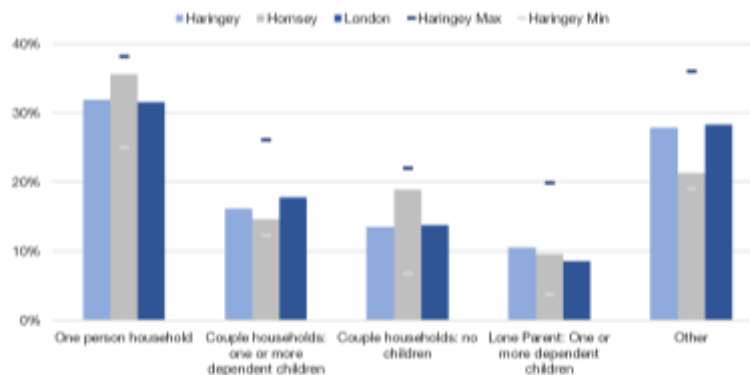
- Tenure in Hornsey largely follows the wider borough pattern, with households most likely to be owned by those living in them. However, Hornsey households are slightly more likely to be social rented (29.5%) than to privately rented (27.9%), which bucks the wider borough trend.

## HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION, HORNSEY

- In Hornsey, one person households (35.6%) and couple households with no children (18.9%) are the most common household types. Both of these household types are over-represented in Hornsey compared to the Haringey average, while couple households with dependent children are comparatively under-represented.

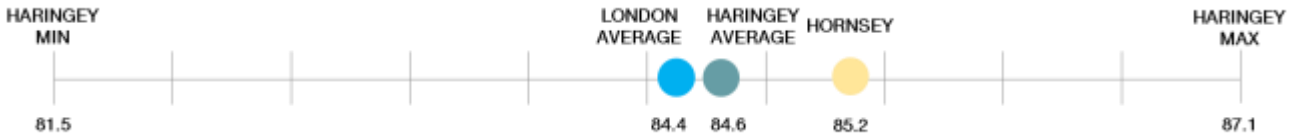

# HEALTH, WELLBEING & CRIME

## FEMALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, HORNSEY

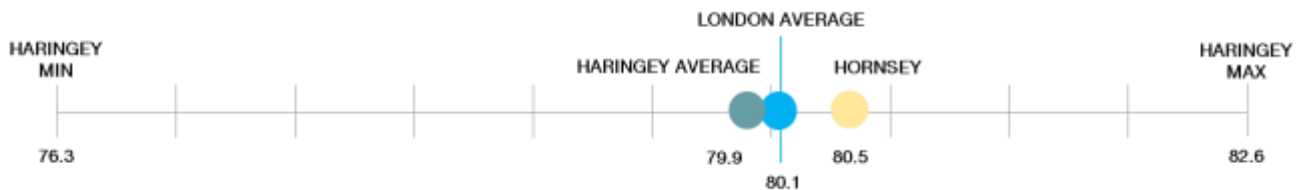
- Female life expectancy in Hornsey is 85.2 years, above the Haringey (84.6) and London (84.4) averages. Despite being higher than average, this is not among the highest levels in Haringey.

## MALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, HORNSEY

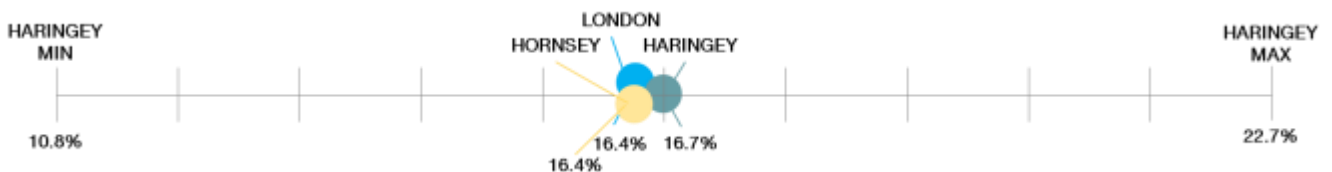
- Male life expectancy in Hornsey is 80.5 years, above the Haringey (79.9) and London (80.1) averages. This is not among the highest levels in Haringey.

## RESIDENTS WITH A LIMITING LONG-TERM HEALTH PROBLEM OR DISABILITY, HORNSEY

- In Hornsey 16.4% of residents have a limiting long-term health problem or disability. This is slightly below the rate seen in Haringey (16.7%) and in line with the level in London more widely (16.4%).

## % PREVALENCE OF EXCESS WEIGHT IN YEAR 6, HORNSEY

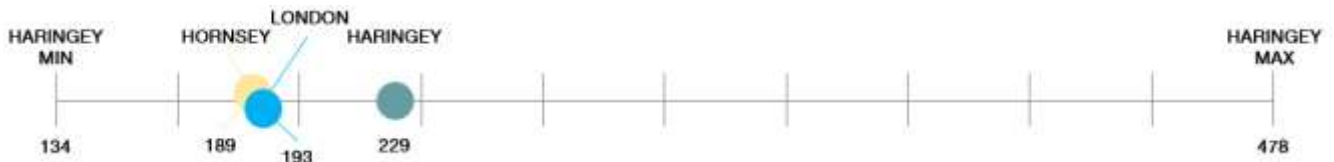
- 29.4% of Year 6 children in Hornsey have excess weight. This is below the Haringey (36.1%) and London (36.8%) averages, though not among the lowest rates of all Haringey wards.

## RATE OF CRIME, HORNSEY

- In Hornsey there were 189 crimes per 1,000 residents between January 2018 and December 2019 (this relates to any type of crime, from drug use or theft to violence against the person).
- This was below the Haringey and in line with London levels (229 per 1,000 residents and 193 per 1,000 residents respectively), though it is not among the lowest levels in the borough.
- The rate of crime in Haringey is more than 18% above the London rate.
