

HARINGEY WARD PROFILE: TOTTENHAM HALE

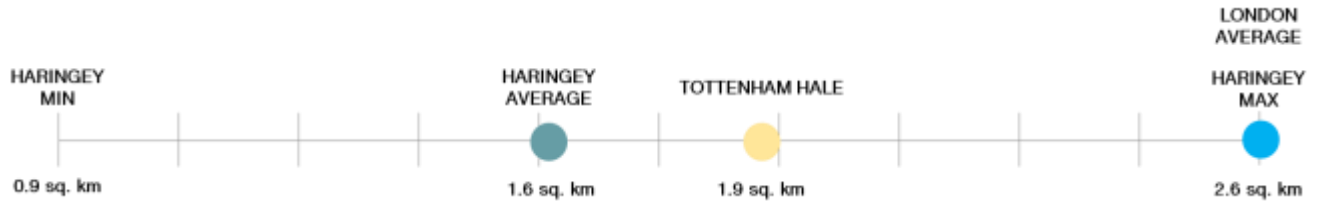


Haringey's Ward Profiles rely on data sources that provide a breakdown to ward-level. Such granular data is less widely available than data at regional or borough level, and as such certain measures use data going back to the 2011 Census. Please be aware of the source and year when using the data cited in this profile.

TOTTENHAM HALE ATTRIBUTES

SIZE OF WARD (SQ. KM), TOTTENHAM HALE

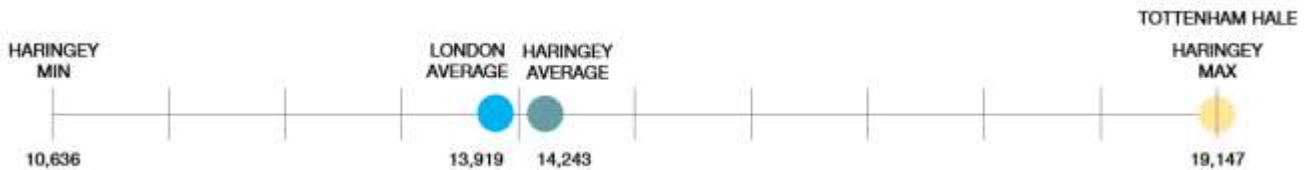
- At 1.9 sq. km, Tottenham Hale is larger than the Haringey average (1.6 sq. km), but smaller than the size of the average London ward (2.6 sq. km).

POPULATION, TOTTENHAM HALE

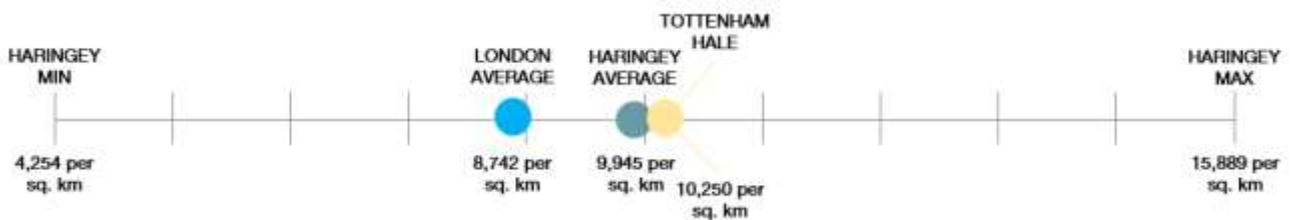
- Tottenham Hale has the largest population of all Haringey wards, with 19,147 residents. This is substantially larger than the average Haringey (14,243) or London (13,919) ward.

POPULATION DENSITY (RESIDENTS PER SQ. KM), TOTTENHAM HALE

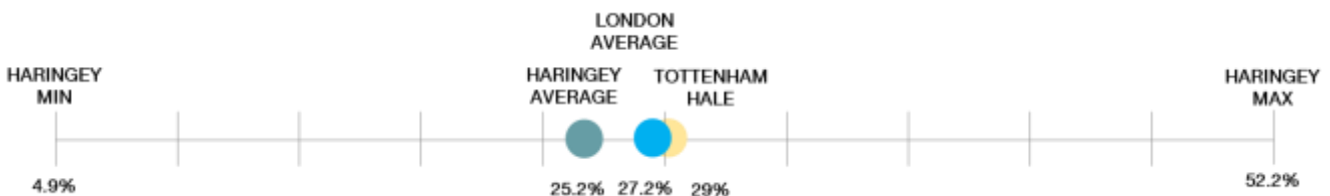
- Despite having a larger population than the London average (8,742), population density in Tottenham Hale is in line with the Haringey average, at 10,250 residents per sq. km compared to an average of 9,945 in Haringey.

OPEN SPACE, TOTTENHAM HALE

- 29% of Tottenham Hale ward is made up of open space, above the Haringey (25.2%) and London (27.2%) averages.

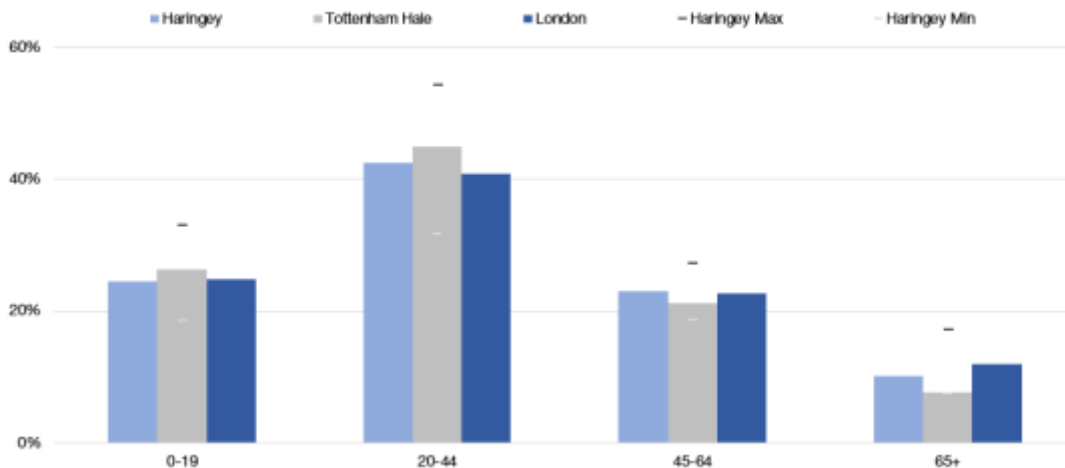

DEMOGRAPHICS

POPULATION AGE, TOTTENHAM HALE

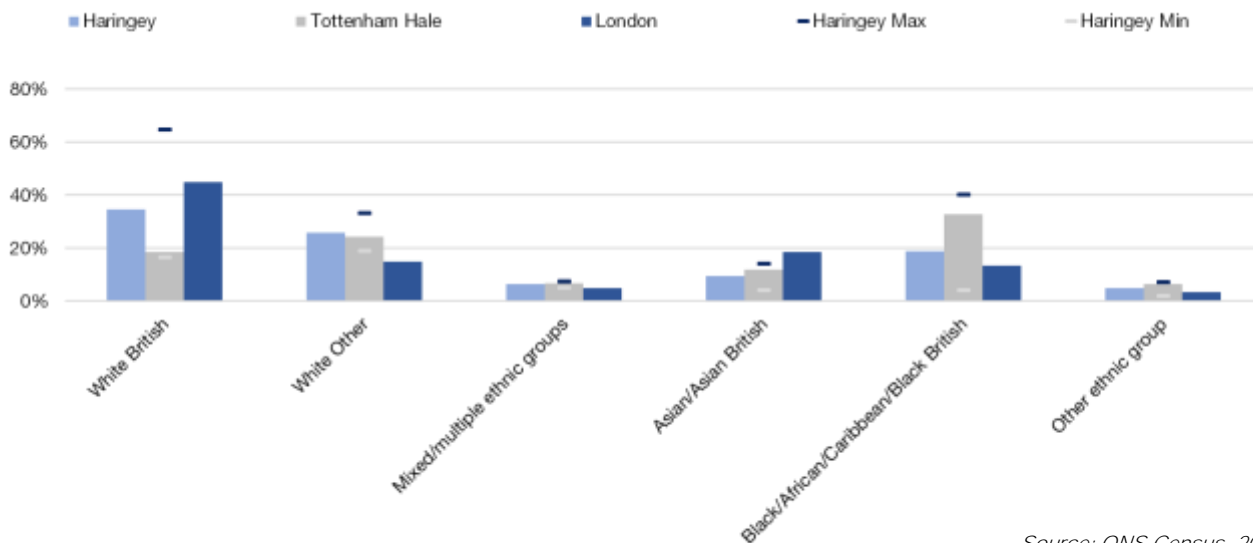
- Tottenham Hale's overall population spread mirrors that seen in Haringey more widely, with those aged 20-44 making up the largest proportion of residents (44.9%), and those aged 65+ making up the smallest proportion (7.7%).
- While following the wider borough pattern, the 65+ age group is significantly under-represented in Tottenham Hale (7.7%) compared to the rest of Haringey (10.1%).

ETHNICITY, TOTTENHAM HALE

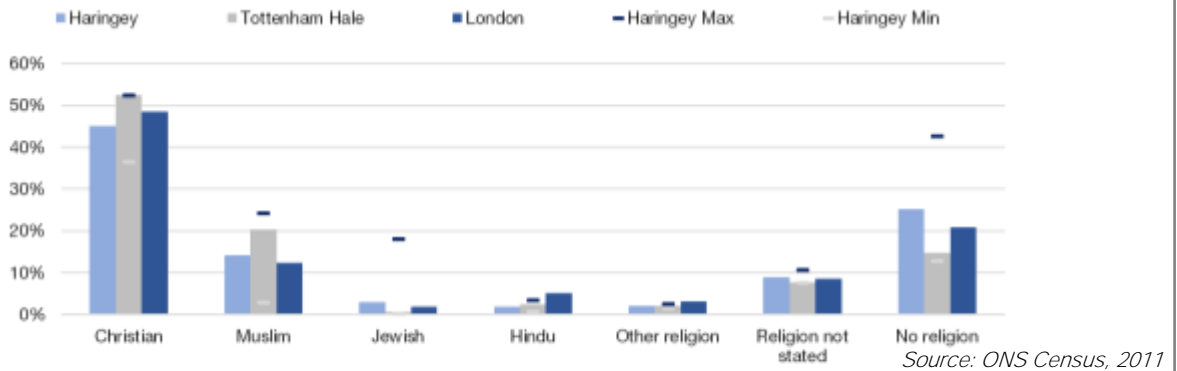
- In Tottenham Hale those of Black ethnicity represent the largest ethnic group (32.7%). This group is over-represented in Tottenham Hale compared to the Haringey average (18.8%).
- Those of White British ethnicity (18.4%) are under-represented in Tottenham Hale compared to the Haringey average (34.7%).

RELIGION, TOTTENHAM HALE

- Tottenham Hale has the largest proportion of residents identifying as Christian (52.4%) of all Haringey wards. There are also more Muslim residents in the ward (20.3%) than the Haringey average (14.2%).
- Residents that do not identify with any religion are under-represented in Tottenham Hale (14.7%), compared to the Haringey average (25.2%).



EDUCATION & QUALIFICATIONS

% PUPILS MEETING THE EXPECTED STANDARD AT KEY STAGE 2, TOTTENHAM HALE

- At KS2 there are a smaller proportion of pupils meeting the expected standard in Tottenham Hale (58.8%) than the average in either Haringey (67.4%) or London (71.4%).

% PUPILS ACHIEVING GRADES 9-4 IN ENGLISH & MATHS, TOTTENHAM HALE

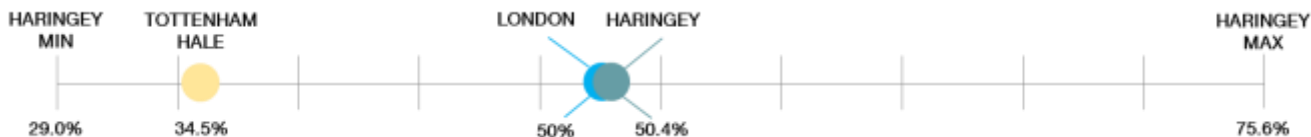
- In Tottenham Hale, the proportion of pupils achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths GCSEs (62%) is lower than the Haringey and London averages (65.1% and 68.8% respectively).
- Despite being below average, Tottenham Hale is not among the lowest levels in the borough.

% QUALIFICATIONS AT LEVEL 3 AND ABOVE, TOTTENHAM HALE

- In Tottenham Hale, the proportion of residents with qualifications at level 3 or higher (34.5%) is significantly below the Haringey (50.4%) and London (50%) averages. This is the third lowest rate of all Haringey wards.
- There is substantial variation in qualification level among different Haringey wards, ranging from 29% being qualified to level 3 or higher, to 75.6%.

INCOME, EMPLOYMENT & TENURE

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME, TOTTENHAM HALE

- The median household income in Tottenham Hale is £27,340 a year. This is notably lower than the Haringey (£37,696) and London (£39,264) averages, and is the third lowest level of all Haringey wards.

UNEMPLOYMENT, TOTTENHAM HALE

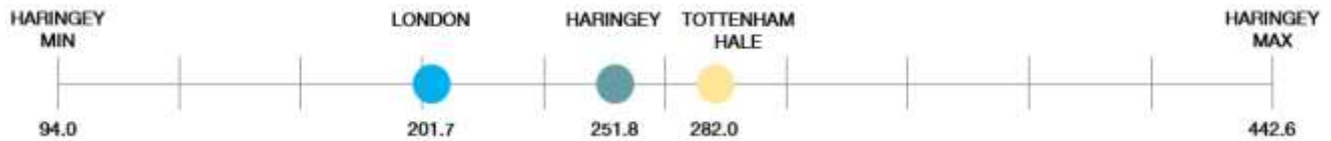
- 11.8% of Tottenham Hale residents are unemployed. This is higher than both the Haringey (8.6%) and London (7.3%) averages.

CLAIMANTS (INC. UNIVERSAL CREDIT & JSA), TOTTENHAM HALE

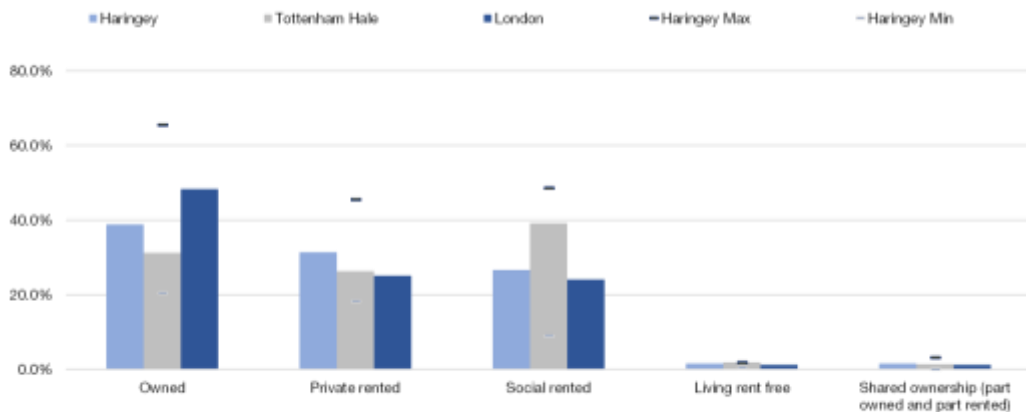
- In Tottenham Hale there are 282 claimants per 10,000 residents who claim benefit principally for the reason of being unemployed.
- This is above both the Haringey and London levels (251.8 per 10,000 residents and 201.7 per 10,000 residents respectively), though it is not among the highest rates of all Haringey wards.
- The rate of claimants in Haringey is almost 25% higher than the London rate.

HOUSING TENURE, TOTTENHAM HALE

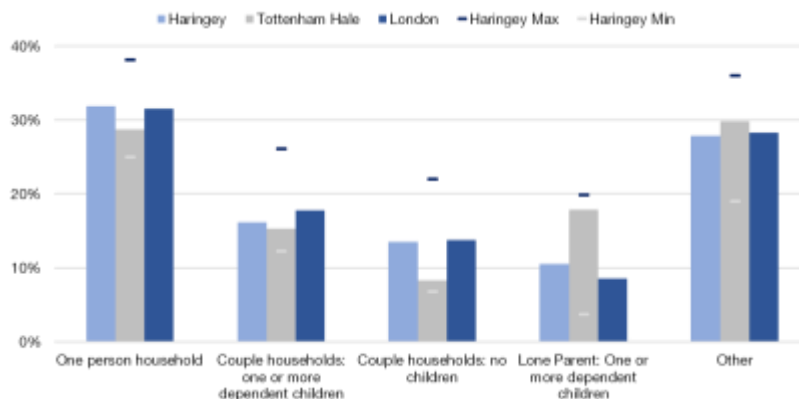
- Tottenham Hale households are most likely to be socially rented (39.2%, a much larger proportion than the borough average of 26.7%).
- Households that are lived in by the homeowners, or which are privately rented, are slightly under-represented in Tottenham Hale.

HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION, TOTTENHAM HALE

- In Tottenham Hale, Lone parent households with dependent children are significantly over-represented (17.9% represent this type of household, compared to 10.5% in Haringey).

HEALTH, WELLBEING & CRIME

FEMALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, TOTTENHAM HALE

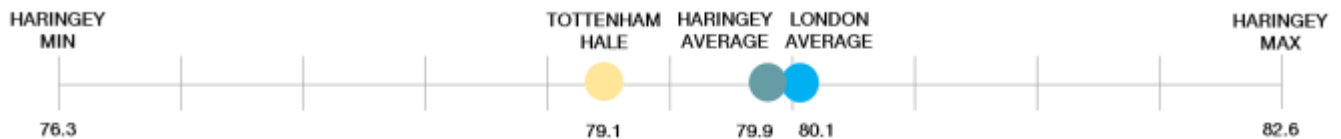
- Female life expectancy in Tottenham Hale is 83.1 years, below the Haringey (84.6) and London (84.4) averages. This is the fourth lowest female life expectancy of all Haringey wards.

MALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, TOTTENHAM HALE

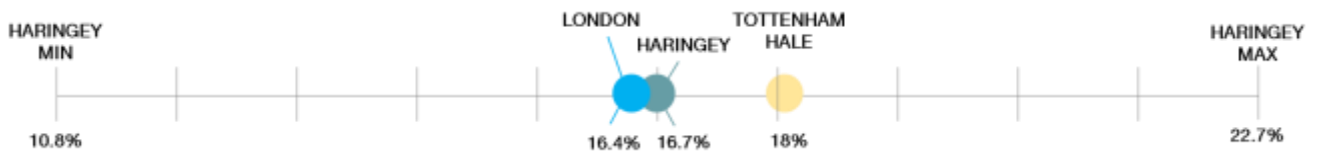
- Male life expectancy in Tottenham Hale is 79.1 years, slightly lower than the Haringey (79.9) and London (80.1) averages.

RESIDENTS WITH A LIMITING LONG-TERM HEALTH PROBLEM OR DISABILITY, TOTTENHAM HALE

- In Tottenham Hale 18% of residents have a limiting long-term health problem or disability. This is slightly higher than the rate seen in Haringey (16.7%) and London (16.4%) more widely.

% PREVALENCE OF EXCESS WEIGHT IN YEAR 6, TOTTENHAM HALE

- 43.2% of Year 6 children in Tottenham Hale have excess weight. This is above the Haringey (36.1%) and London (36.8%) averages.
- Whilst above average Tottenham Hale is not among the highest rates of all Haringey wards.

RATE OF CRIME, TOTTENHAM HALE

- In Tottenham Hale there were 269 crimes per 1,000 residents between January 2018 and December 2019 (this relates to any type of crime, from drug use or theft to violence against the person).
- This was higher than both the Haringey and London levels (229 per 1,000 residents and 193 per 1,000 residents respectively), and is the fourth highest rate of all Haringey wards.
- The rate of crime in Haringey is more than 18% above the London rate.
