This allowed some women – those owning property and over the age of 30 – the right to vote for the first time.</p> <p>The women's suffrage movement reached every part of the country and cut across all classes. Some stories about individual suffragettes and their struggle for the vote are well known to us. Other stories lay untold, forgotten or hidden.</p> <p>This fascinating exhibition presents wonderful stories and research about local women who campaigned for the vote more than 100 years ago. Stories, artefacts and photographs have been kindly shared by relatives proud of these pioneering women in their families. The exhibition tells us about the lives of women - such as the Spongs of Muswell Hill - who made their voices heard in their fierce struggle to get the right to vote.</p>
