This exhibition compliments a display of Althea's fabrics in the larger windows of BCM's East Wing.</p> <p>Althea McNish was an internationally important textile designer and artist who was one of our neighbours - living here in Haringey, in West Green Road in Tottenham for almost sixty years, until her death in 2020.</p> <p>Regarded as part of the Windrush generation, originally from Trinidad, Althea came to the UK in her late teens and had a prestigious career as a designer and became the first woman to rise to prominence in the field of textile design, designing Caribbean inspired fabrics for Liberty and Heal's.</p>
