This will radically disrupt the environmental conservation status of the woods in that area and most likely set a precedent for developing the land which is not welcome, for such an over-developed city in which we are all trying to live. Conservation of any natural resource we hold is surely of utmost priority, to loosen the protection of this site will be not only damaging to the site itself - home to a rich diversity of flora and fauna, but also to the surrounding environment.

Having previously been a resident of Haringey, I noted the lack of green spaces available in the borough. This could be another one less, should it be earmarked for development, which it obviously would be should the status be altered.
