Environmental Management	A very good description on a range of appropriate techniques and methods to reduce the park's impact upon the environment, and maximise use of sustainable resources.	New techniques or tools to increase sustainability on site will arise through the lifetime of the plan, and if they are applied to the site this can be reflected in it, along with assessments of how they work and what benefits they have had.
Biodiversity, Landscape and Heritage	Good approach it is difficult to fully cover the numerous ecological and heritage qualities of a site and this plan does very well in providing an appropriate overview with priority actions.	As key heritage, landscape and ecological assets mature or age, plan should evaluate what changes are required in protecting or maintaining them, or what might be required to remove or replace them if this is felt to be more appropriate.

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Additional comments

This is a good management plan which gets across what happens in the park. There is some duplication which is inevitable. My major comment would be that there is very little aspiration for the park. I understand that this is difficult whilst you go through restructure and austerity, but there needs to be something for the space to aspire to.

We do like the action plan but think it could contain more. What about the railings? They should be listed even if you have no idea at present how to fund. Make it a list of all those things you need to do. To be self-financing etc. put a date and then add comments each year, update this annually and then look at rest of management plan say every 5/10 years unless something really significant happens. That will show the course you are travelled with the space.

Management	<p>The Park managers manage the functional areas of the park and demonstrated not only passion but support and knowledge around community involvement in line with the Councils 2023 strategic vision report details recommended approaches where people can lead active and healthy lives in an environment that is safe, clean and green.</p> <p>Although budgets have been affected by austerity the Park hosts a number of local organisations that lease their buildings/assets with the aim of independently sustaining their green space. For example the leasing buildings to local organisations Little friends nursery, Fatisa restaurant or the Mushroom Building etc.</p>	The Councils strategic vision report has a strong focus on fundraising and maximising the commercial potential of the site based on public benefit, heritage and ecological value.
